100K Donation Drive Update

We started the donation drive February 1st and we extended it to March 12. We were able to achieve a participation rate of 52%. With this donation drive, we were able to raise over \$7,000 (\$7,056) and donations received specific for Academic Needs usage = \$1,630.

PTO will make our 2nd donation to the school in the amount of \$9,000 later this month.

Donations are continued to be accepted via PTO website donation page. You can choose what your donation would like to be used for - academic needs, school needs, special program, or for next school year's curriculum (which includes technology updates, textbooks for all subjects, and consumable workbooks.

Thank-you to everyone, for participating in the school-wide donation drive. Gifts are being distributed to all students. If your student is in-school, gifts were received yesterday and today. If your child is doing virtual learning only, gifts can be picked up at the material pickup or from the office. Celebration Party will take place on Friday 3/26 @12:30pm via Zoom.

 - Jog-A-Thon led by academic committee and PTO Board


Events for the remainder of the year

MARCH:

APRIL:


Yakitori Stand Fundraiser/ Yakitori Stand - a grilled skewer chicken stand - which we've had in previous Fall/Spring Festivals. School has approved the event to take place on school property on a Friday (date to be determined). Most likely, event will take place end of April/ Beginning of May and we will be taking online orders via PTO website and pick-up times will be provided, to avoid crowds.

MAY

Jog-A-Thon - May 1-16. A Virtual event. This event is to support a \$10,000 goal for next year's academic curriculum material.

Kiyoka will discuss the details of this event. This will be the last fundraiser of the year.

- We changed the dates from April to May due to testing in April.
- Using 99 Places again for this platform.
- Donations and Corporate Sponsors, local businesses needed. Need parents to help to share sponsorship letter and package information.
- Registration opens mid-April. Registration period is longer than usual to allow for t-shirt orders. Ideally, participating students and parents buy t-shirt and wear while they run/jog/walk.
- Incentive, such as prizes, to motivate kids to participate. Possibly do a classroom competition?
- We will use ICAGa News Minute to share event info with teachers & students. Principal Jones confirmed.

Celebration for 5th grade and Kindergarten - This year will be the milestones for those grades, as 5th grade will be moving on to Middle School and Kindergarten moving into 1st grade.

Additional questions:

- 1. Do we offer a student's individual school picture in the memory book (like we would in a yearbook)?
 - More like a collection of photos and messages. We would need consent from parents to include individual student picture with names.
- 2. With the shooting in Cherokee Country A concerned parent wants to know what the school is doing to keep our kids safe? Parent reviewed policies and procedures the school has in place, in case of emergency. In reviewing the student handbook, the school does have a procedure and drills for lockdown and parent wanted to know a little bit more about it from Ms. Jones.
 - Ms. Jones we have lockdown drills, done monthly as required by state. Extra precautions were taken by school, in terms of how teachers and students are moving around the building. School is not using cafeteria for classes and being very cautious. School reached out to local police department to increase patrolling of school and presence around the building. Drill information can be provided in the next newsletter.
- 3. A parent asked if school will be getting additional funding, with the new Covid Relief bill that was passed.

Ms. Jones - We did apply for new funding and waiting to hear if we will be getting it. As soon as we know, we will provide an update. Next week is our Board meeting, and we expect to have a report from our CFO on that, in terms of what funding can/are we getting.
